The Mpumalanga Regional Training Trust (MRTT) ploughed back to the Community of Kwa-Guqa by renovating Nkonjane Combine School to improve the learning condition of the learners as part of Mandela day celebration.

During school visits, the Principal of the school Ms ThalithaSihlangu requested the assistance of MRTT to install electricity and butler proof after it was damaged.

MRTT responded to the call by using its trainees under the supervision of Welding and Electrical facilitators. It was very difficult for the learners to learn in those classrooms especial during winter as the classrooms were dark due to the unavailability of lights.

The MRTT students installed electrical wiring to 16 classrooms that was vandalised and fit butler proof to the Management staff rooms. It took the students ten days to complete the work.

The Principal of Nkonjane Combine School appreciated the work that was done by MRTT students and the entirely organization to respond positive when assistance was needed.
